## Supplementary Materials, Appendix S1

Appendix S<sub>1</sub> contains supplemental information pertinent to the statistical analysis in the article "Bargaining Power at the Negotiation Table and Beyond."

Table S1 includes the list of treaties included in the dataset that supports the conclusions of this article.

The article includes a table presenting the statistical findings. For the sake of conciseness, the table only reports whether treaty type was accounted for in the statistical analysis. Table S2 presented here includes the same set of models but with the covariates based on treaty type reported. Note that for these variables the comparison category is human rights treaties so that positive variables indicate higher ratification rate than human rights agreements and negative variables indicate lower ratification rate than human rights agreements.

The models presented in the article include only the theoretical variables of interest for the sake of brevity. The rest of the web appendix illustrates that the findings presented in the article are relatively robust to model specification. Where there are differences it is in that in some of the models treaties spearheaded by G7 states are more likely to be ratified than the baseline (non-G7 and non-G77). However, to avoid type II errors the article reports the more conservative findings. Table S3 accounts for different characteristics of the treaties that could affect ratification rate. It includes a dummy variable for annexes as these treaties might be more likely to get support given that they will likely be on issues that have generated widespread ratification in the past. Additionally, states may signal the salience of a treaty in the preamble and thus treaties with longer preambles may be more widely ratified than treaties with shorter preambles. Preamble length is measured in the number of words and is logged due to skewness. Table S3 supports these propositions.

One factor that came across as important in the qualitative case studies was the role of the initial drafter of the treaty. Table S4 therefore considers an alternative measure of power for treaties drafted initially by G<sub>77</sub> states and G<sub>7</sub> states. In the dataset very few treaties were drafted by a single country and in particularly very few G<sub>77</sub> states proposed an initial draft of a treaty on their own. However, the findings presented in Table S4 indicate that treaties drafted by G<sub>7</sub> states have higher ratification rates than the baseline, although the 95% interval for the coefficient overlaps with the 95% confidence interval for G<sub>77</sub> states. Thus, these findings are consistent with the findings presented in the article.

The final factor that may be important to consider in terms of ratification rate may be the role of time in the process. Table S5 evaluates two arguments. The first is that treaties that are a product of delayed negotiations may get lower ratification rate due to difficulties in reaching an agreement. Alternatively, delays could mean that states value the agreement more and may fight harder and thus bargain lower in which case delayed negotiations could be associated with higher ratification (Fearon 1998 add). This factor is accounted for with a variable that accounts for negotiations that have lasted longer than 5 years (1825 days). The second factor is that the dataset records ratification rate at one point in time (2014) and that treaties that have been open for less time will have lower ratification rate. Therefore this factor is controlled for with an indicator of whether a treaty has only been open for fewer than 10 years. The coefficients presented in Table S5 for delayed negotiations are not statistically significant. The coefficients for delayed negotiations are statistically

significant indicating that treaties that have been open for less than ten years have lower ratification rates than other treaties.

Table S6, finally, presents full models with all of these factors accounted for in a single model and shows that the findings in the full model are consistent with those in the individual tables. Thus based on these additional factors, preamble length, annexes and treaties drafted by G7 states are positively associated with ratification rate. Treaties that have only been opened for fewer than ten years are associated with lower ratification rate. Figs. S1-4 show the marginal effect of these variables. In only one of these figures, Fig. S4 that compares treaties based on how long they have been available to ratify, do the confidence intervals overlap. Thus while the signs and statistical significance of the variables are interesting, the large lack of substantive significance indicates that these findings are consistent with those presented in this article.




FIGURE S1 Marginal effects number of words in the preamble on ratification rate





FIGURE S2 Marginal effects of annexes on ratification rate



 $\label{eq:figure S3} \textbf{Marginal effects of drafting party on ratification rate}$ 




FIGURE S4 Marginal effect of time available to ratify
